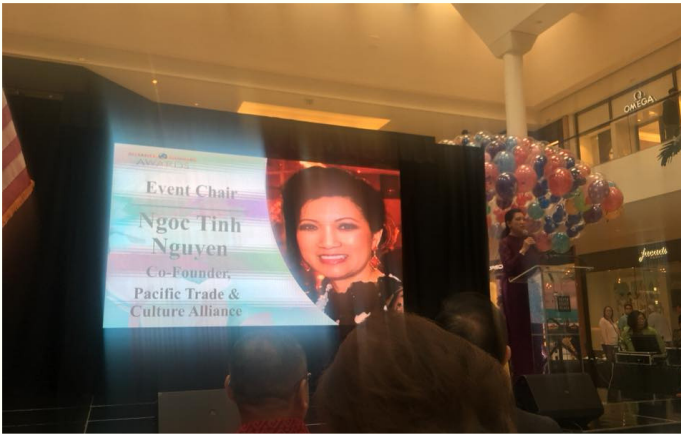
Meet & Greets for George Chen, Sean Flynn
