On October 19, our Non Profit Asian Industry B2B teamed up with Blexit CA (a 501c3) to throw a family and faith oriented fair in the parking lot of one of the churches in Walnut. It was a minority-centric event that brought together families all over California to partake in educational resources.

But the county of LA had a different plan. They have selected chosen to fine and persecute not just our event (we ended up with a \$2000 fine) but have also targeted other minority churches - largely those operated by Asian and Hispanic pastors and congregations.

As a minorities and millennial ministry leaders, the last thing we expected is to have to become a fierce defender of conservative and Christian rights in America, the country of religious freedom.

This is NOT OKAY. This is not the America that many of us immigrated to. Under the first amendment, we have freedom of religion and to *peacefully* gather. The county of LA has chosen to specifically target these groups.

Join us in helping to fight against religious persecution of ALL types and to bring about legal and constitutional justice to all Americans regardless of race and religious belief.
